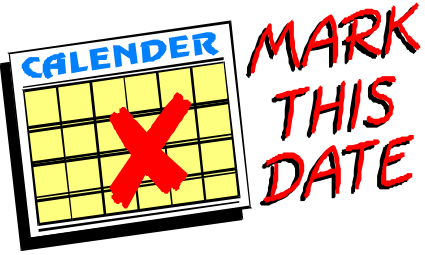

2017 Professional Seminar

Eric Garner, KSCPM President, started this year’s seminar by expressing his excitement about the agenda that was scheduled for the day and his appreciation for everyone’s attendance. This year our Professional Seminar was titled “Developing a Vision for the Future” and with our outstanding speakers it did not disappoint.

Our first speaker was Mike Keyser who works for the Department of Criminal Justice Training. He started the seminar off with upbeat and informational remarks of some of his personal struggles and accomplishments of achieving visions that he had set for himself and those he supervised. He said to hit conflict head on so that each person knows where they stand and works towards the end goal.

The next speaker was Danette Wilder who is the President & CEO of SealingLife, Inc. Since she works in a corporate atmosphere, she brought a unique outlook to ways that visions can be developed. The use of websites and goals of other entities can help support the way a vision can be obtained.

Jason Bailey is the Executive Director for the Kentucky Center for Economic Policy. He spoke on a subject that is at the forefront of all state government employees minds and that is retirement. His expertise gave insight on the different areas of the economy that play into making future decisions on the funding of all the different types of retirement plans.

Larry Totten is not only a KSCPM Board member but he is the President of the Kentucky Public Retirees organization. He gave an update on the state retirement. He has been to many meetings pertaining to the status of the current and future state government retirement pension.

The next speaker was David Jude. He recently retired as a Major with the Kentucky State Police and is now the first Executive Director for the Kentucky State Police Foundation. The title for his section was “Implementing Your Leadership Vision – A Practical Example of Success”. He explained a specific vision and the process he went through in achieving that goal while working for KSP. It was very interesting and gave insight on how to bridge the entire process together.

The Interim Executive Director for the Kentucky Retirement Systems, David Eager, had an engaging presentation.

Again, the topic that seems to be on every state employees mind, whether they are a current employee or a retiree, is what is going to happen to the retirement pension account and will there be enough money to pay all retirees.

Although these were just a few highlights from each speaker, valuable information was given that can be used in developing a vision for future goals.

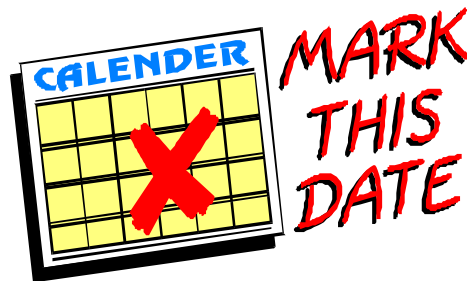
